
CHRIST'S TRANSFORMING LOVE



Franklin District Report 2024

Celebrating 58 years of service! We send greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to the Institutions, Agencies, Churches and people of the Franklin District of LMC. The purpose of Cove Valley Christian Youth Camp is to provide a place and the opportunity for Christian teaching and fellowship along with wholesome and guided recreation in a spiritual atmosphere.

This summer was the fourth highest summer since 1992 with 408 campers. Franklin District sent 67 campers or 16%. The theme this summer was "Soar,Run,Walk". The good news is 23 made new commitments to Christ and started their new life at the camp. Other campers recommitted or made some other commitments to Christ (95). So many lives are changed at camp. It is a privilege to be a part of it.

Guest groups make up an important part of the ministry. God has brought new groups and new opportunities along so that His camp is being used to glorify Him. We depend on our guest group income to supply 10-12% of our summer camp support. A highlight was hosting Trail Life USA's regional ManCamp. Over 200 men and boys learned more about becoming a true Man of God.

Our adult retreats were a success this year. Brian Emery spoke at the Golden Age Retreat. It is always a wonderful week of encouragement and fellowship. Jeremy Miller from Rosedale Bible College ministered to the many families that came. It was great to see young families encouraging one another and see all the children that God is raising up for the next generation.

God has blessed us with a fine staff. Lynn Hanson worked this summer as the Program Assistant, Amy Frey is equally amazing in her 5th year as Food Service Director, Sarah Eshleman is helping out as Food Service Assistant, Paul Frey has kept the camp in great shape for 22 years as Maintenance Director and Eric Roth completed his 14th summer doing a fantastic job as Program Director. Darlene Shaffer has faithfully worked as our Housekeeper for 8 years in a part time capacity. I (Allen) completed my 28th year at the camp.

Moss Spring Campground has been added to the camp to allow for those who enjoy camping and would like to do so in a family friendly atmosphere. The campground currently has 12 sites with full hookups and a number of primitive sites. Private bathrooms with showers and a pavilion make an inviting area to have to meals or celebrate a special event.

The Board of Directors continues to seek God's guidance in making decisions for the camp. Jon Rotz, Charles Dean, Chad Wadel, Stephanie Smith and Peter Frey make up the Executive Committee. Other board members are Royce Eby, Evan Dean, Hans Lehman, Delton Lehman, Scott Sollenberger and Devin Horst. One position is still open.

In communities torn by violence and conflict, people like Melanie Mafinga, right, live out Christ's call to peace with dedication, courage and persistence.

Mafinga lives in Kikwit in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DR Congo). She helps to mediate and resolve conflicts and prevent violence through Women Situation Rooms (WSR), an effort MCC supports through the Communauté des Eglises de Frères Mennonites au Congo, or the Mennonite Brethren Church of Congo, and Communauté Mennonite au Congo, or Mennonite Church of Congo.

"It is the word of God. Peace comes from God himself," she says, explaining why she gives her own time for this work.

DR Congo has faced decades of bloodshed caused by warring armed groups. "Big conflicts happen because problems at the grassroots level are not solved," says Jacob Sankara, MCC peacebuilding coordinator in DR Congo.

Mafinga is one of 50 women from the Mennonite Brethren Church of Congo who have taken multiple trainings from MCC staff since 2019. Those 50 have trained 155 others, including men. In early 2024, MCC was supporting 67 WSR groups in DR Congo with 3,602 members.

This is one example of the hope and help that your support and prayers bring in 45 countries around the world.

Thank you for partnering with us to meet needs in the face of conflict, to pray and to work for a world where the peace of Christ can rule in our hearts and our communities.

For families caught in conflict or displaced from their homes in Ukraine, colorful comforters provide needed winter warmth and remind people that they are not alone in their suffering. From April 2023 through March 2024, MCC provided 40,760 comforters, 57,600 hygiene kits, 16,800 relief kits and 36,000 pounds of canned meat to partners in Ukraine.

Bangladesh Arsenic Mitigation Partnership:

Helping Bangladeshis cope with the largest mass poisoning in human history (according to the World Health Organization)

We are a group of MCC Bangladesh alumni who are partnering with mission organization SIM Bangladesh to help the rural poor in the southern part of the country deal with the highest levels of arsenic in their drinking water found in the world.

MCC now works primarily in the far northwest of the country, where arsenic is not a significant problem; so they do not have a current arsenic-related project.

They are, however, very encouraging of our partnership with SIM Bangladesh, as they know the ongoing severity of the crisis. We keep them updated with project progress.

There is a lot of hope for this crisis. This is a problem with a solution! Safe, uncontaminated water is the solution. We are partnering with SIM Bangladesh to provide that! We have raised funds so far for a first expansion of SIM Bangladesh's arsenic project, which has operated successfully for over 20 years, but only in a small area. Education sessions, water testing, and filter distribution started in the expansion area late summer 2023, and the first mobile medical clinics were held in the new area earlier this year. This expansion will help and save thousands more lives.

Examples of what donated money does (US dollars):

- Annual screening for 10 patients: \$25
- Kit to test 50 wells: \$70
- Household filters for 10 households:
 \$200 (each filter lasts 5 years or more)
- Project worker monthly salary: \$300


LEADERSHIP ASSEMBLIES






LMC GRANTS





En el CMM, **seguir a Jesús juntos** (Mateo 4) está en el centro de nuestro llamado.


